THE CHALLENGE

Today, over 800 million people in the world are malnourished and one in eight goes to bed hungry every night. By 2050 the world's population is projected to increase from 7.18 billion to over 9 billion people. A critical aspect of meeting the challenge of feeding this expanding population is educating the next generation of leaders in international agriculture and rural development.

In 1997, the Association for International Agriculture and Rural Development (AIARD) began addressing this challenge. AIARD initiated the AIARD Student Scholarship program and brought seven outstanding students to Washington to attend the AIARD Annual Conference. In 2005 the program was expanded to become the Future Leader's Forum, to provide scholarships for 12 students, and to include a student tour of Washington, DC agencies and organizations relevant to global food security. Since that time, through this popular program, AIARD has been actively helping to build the cadre of leaders who will guide and implement tomorrow's international agriculture and rural development programs.
